

Internet-Based Diabetes Self-Management Certificate Program

This program is directed at community pharmacists. The assignments can be applied by pharmacists practicing in hospitals and other settings as long as the pharmacist has access to 3 to 4 patients with diabetes

Program objectives:

- 1) Provide a toolbox of diabetes patient education materials.
- 2) Teach the diabetes care skills needed for patient diabetes self-management training.
- 3) Review the current drug therapy, nutrition and physical activity treatment strategies for diabetes.
- 4) Provide practice application assignments to allow the pharmacist to implement the service into the pharmacy's programs.

Estimated time commitment & requirements to participate:

The four-month program will start on August 29th, 2005 and conclude on December 16th, 2005. Participants will spend 6-8 hours per week for these 4 months on assignments. Moderate computer skills are required. Access to Pentium-based IBM PC with 56k or faster modem, an Internet provider with email account and Real Player, Adobe Acrobat Reader, Microsoft Office (Word and Powerpoint) is required to participate. The participant also must be available for 5 chat sessions scheduled for the weeks of Sept. 26th, Oct. 17th, Nov. 7th, Nov. 28th and Dec. 12th. Participants must attend one of the three chats scheduled for that week. The chats are scheduled at 9 pm Eastern (8 pm Central) on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday evenings.
